### Seacoast United Announces Entrance Into WPSL for 2010 Season April 2009

On Thursday April 23rd, 2009, Seacoast United announced the addition of a Women's Amateur Team to it's already impressive developmental model. The Club will be joining the Eastern Division of the Women's Premier Soccer League (WPSL) for the spring/summer 2010 season. The Club will play a 10 game schedule against the likes of FSA Soccer Plus, Boston Aztecs, New England Mutiny, New York Athletic Club, Adirondack Lynx, Bay State Select, Lancaster Inferno, and Maine Tide. The WPSL season begins mid-May and ends with a championship during the first week of August.

WPSL teams roster players currently at the high school and collegiate levels, as well as post-collegiate and foreign players. The league consists of over 50 teams playing in 5 conferences across the country.

When asked about the reason for creating this team, General Manager Matt Sprague said, "Because it is the right thing to do for our players. We have a greater amount of players going off to play at top college programs. Currently we do not offer them an option that gives them the level of competition and training commitment necessary for their development. We not only want to help our players get into the colleges they choose but also to continue to play at a high level for those colleges."

There is also an impact that this team will have on the youth players in the Club. "Our younger players will have, for the first time, a team and players to look up to. Boys and girls alike will be able to look at the players on this team as role models both on and off the field. This will turn out to be a great teaching aid for our younger teams because it will get more of our players watching the game, and the game itself is the greatest teacher," commented Sprague.

The Aztec came away with a 4-0 victory on goals by forward Tiffany Weimer (WPS/Boston Breakers), Elizabeth Bogus (WPS/Boston Breakers) 2 from midfielder Leah Blaney (Australia).

Seacoast came out to a strong start, frustrating the Aztecs & giving up very little on the defensive side of the ball. Seacoast United's back four of Chelsey Tewell (York Harbor, ME), Kelly Spencer (University of NH/Exeter NH), Kendall Booth (East Carolina University/Epping NH), and Jacquelyn Zani (UMass-Lowell/Salem NH) held a high line, catching the Aztec attack offside a number of times. With just under 2 minutes left in the half the Aztec broke through, playing a ball over the top forcing Seacoast goalkeeper Jill Schott (10 saves) into a tough situation just outside the top of the box where Aztec forward Tiffany Weimer put it away for the 1-0 lead.

Seacoast came out with the same intensity in the 2nd half and had a couple chances early on. After Seacoast had worked the ball deep into the offensive end & earned a corner, Aztec midfielder Leah Blaney broke away on the clearance and made it 2-0 in the 61st minute.

The Aztec capitalized again in the 67th (L. Blaney) from 8 yds out on a missed clearance, and in the 85th minutes (E. Bogus). In total, the Aztec had 14 shots on goal.

Seacoast United's next home game is scheduled for June 5th vs. the New England Mutiny at 6pm. Admission is free for children 4 and under. Clarke had a very strong game in the midfield for Seacoast despite missing minutes in the 2nd half due to injury.

The New England Mutiny's missed on a great opportunity when midfielder Danielle Dakin sent a cross just outside the 6 yd box to forward Mary Francis Monroe in the 65th minute. Monroe's header was blocked by Seacoast keeper **Jill Schott** (Windham, NH/Providence College), who had 9 saves on the afternoon. The Mutiny finally capitalized 9 minutes later, scoring the equalizer in the 74th minute when forward Sarah Brochu's strike beat Schott low to the left corner. The goal was Brochu's 3rd in as many games.

In the final 10 minutes, both teams went end to end looking for the elusive game winner. The Mutiny held the overall advantage in shots, 18-9. The teams will face each other again in just over a week when the Mutiny plays host to Seacoast United at 5pm on Sunday, June 13th at Chicopee Comprehensive High School (MA).

Seacoast United's next home game will take place at Bowdoin College on Saturday June 19th vs. the Maine Tide. ## Roberge Strikes Twice As Seacoast United Tops Maine Tide 4-1

BRUNSWICK, ME - Seacoast United's WPSL team earned its first win of the season with a 4-1 victory over the Maine Tide. Seacoast is now 1-3-1 on the season while the loss drops the Tide to 0-5-0.

The match took place at Bowdoin College in Brunswick, ME as part of the [Coastal Summer Challenge](#). Seacoast got out to a great start when midfielder **Emma Clark** (Boston University/York, ME) scored in the 4th minute off of a pass from **Monique Lamotte** (University of NH/Tampa, FL). In the 20th minute, Lamotte scored a goal of her own after receiving a pass from left back **Chelsey Tewell** (York Harbor, ME), beating Maine Tide keeper Jennifer Andrews to the right side.

The Tide made adjustments at the break and started the 2nd half pressing forward. The strategy worked, as they were able to capitalize on a communication mishap when Tide midfielder Hannah Breton (University of Maine) caught Seacoast keeper **Jen Nichols** (Ryder University/Stratham, NH) off her line and brought her team within 1.

Seacoast bounced back however, and took control of the game from there. In the 17th minute, **Caroline Boyce** (SUSC/Canterbury, NH) assisted on a **Kaleigh Roberge** (Southern NH University/Manchester, NH) blast from 20 yds out, giving Seacoast the 3-1 lead. Just three minutes later, Roberge struck again on a goal almost identical to her first.

The win is Seacoast United's first as part of the WPSL. Their next match is Saturday, June 26th on the road vs. the Boston Aztec Breakers Reserves at Progin Park in Lancaster, MA. Kickoff is scheduled for 2pm. Seacoast's next home game is Friday, July 9th vs. Boston 23's.

## Boston Aztec Top Seacoast United 3-1 Saturday, June 26, 2010

Seacoast United faced the Boston Aztec Breakers Reserves at Citizen's Bank Park in Lancaster, MA as part of the Massachusetts Tournament of Champions weekend. It is the second meeting between the two teams this season. Although Seacoast was able to score first, the Aztec battled back for a 3-1 victory.

Seacoast struggled to keep possession early in the first half, playing a majority of the time in their own end of the field. But in the 23rd minute, striker **Kaitlyn Hinck** (Bow, NH/Bryant University) sent a through ball to midfielder **Kendra Spencer** (Petosky, MI/Keene State) who kept the ball low to beat Aztec keeper Allison Lipsher to the near post.

Just ten minutes later, the Aztec responded. Co-WPSL Player of the Week Leah Blaney, capitalized on a loose ball at the top of the box, beating Seacoast goalkeeper **Jill Schott** (9 saves) high to the left. Six minutes later, the Aztec struck again on an Anna Canaglia shot (unassisted) from wide left of the 18 yd box, taking a 2-1 lead into halftime.

Seacoast United's had a few great opportunities to equalize in the 2nd half. In the 75th minute, midfielder **Megan Cain** (Norwich, VT/Lehigh University) passed the ball to an overlapping **Chelsey Tewell** (York Harbor, ME/Seacoast United Soccer Club), who sent a cross into the 6 yd box for midfielder **Jackie Zani** (Salem, NH/UMass Lowell). Zani's header missed just over the crossbar. Still pushing forward, Cain won a tough tackle deep in Aztec territory and had a chance on a 1v1 but was blocked by Lipsher. The Aztec fell victim to the offside trap several times in the half, but were able to break through the Seacoast back four in the 87th minute for their 3rd goal of the afternoon by Barbara Lindsay. Overall the Aztec held a 10:3 advantage in shots on goal and a 3:0 advantage on corner kicks.

The next game for Seacoast United is on Saturday July 3rd when they travel to Endicott College to play the Boston 23's, with kickoff scheduled for 1pm. Seacoast United's record falls to 1-4-1 on the season.

### **WPSL Game Change For Friday July 9<sup>th</sup> vs. Boston Aztec U23's**

Friday, July 9th's game against the Boston Aztec U23's has been changed. The match will now take place at the [Seacoast United Outdoor Complex](#) in Epping, NH. Kickoff is still scheduled for 6pm.



Friday's match is the 2nd meeting between the Boston Aztec U23's and Seacoast United. This past Saturday July 3rd, the Aztec's Jess Luscinski scored the game's only goal in the 81st minute for the 1-0 win over Seacoast at Endicott College (Beverly, MA).
